The revised WDHS asbestos rule affects Wisconsin contractors conducting renovation, demolition and restoration activities. Also, beginning in April 2010, contractors performing renovation, repair and painting projects that disturb lead-based paint in homes, child care facilities, and schools built before 1978 must be certified and must follow specific work practices to prevent lead contamination.

- Does your work impact (disturb or remove) more than one waste bag (no larger than 60" by 60") of building materials other than metal, glass, wood, or fiberglass?
- Does your work disturb vermiculite insulation?
- Do you conduct renovation/restoration activities in dwellings constructed prior to 1978 and child-occupied facilities constructed before 1978 that provide child care services, preschools, or public or private schools?

If the answer is "yes" to any of these questions, be sure to make plans to join the Milwaukee Chapter of the IAQA on Thursday April 1, 2010 to learn about how (not if) these Rules will affect your projects.
